The Website Design and Structure section explains the website's alignment with the NoLeFa project identity and the selection of the Neve theme for its performance, accessibility, and responsiveness across devices. The website's structure is designed for intuitive navigation, with a homepage that serves as the main entry point providing immediate clarity on the what the project does and who is involved, and access to key pages such as "Who We Are," "What We Do," "Work Packages," "Deliverables," "Events," and "Contact." The footer includes acknowledgment of EU funding and links to the Privacy Policy.

This document serves as an essential reference for understanding the NoLeFa website's role within the project, its ongoing evolution, and its function as a communication and dissemination tool. The website will continue to be developed and updated throughout the project's duration to ensure relevance and effectiveness in reaching its target audience.

## 1. Introduction

This document "D6.1 Project Website" is a deliverable of the Work package No. 6 "Dissemination and workshops", task T6.1 "Outreach" under the task lead of CAIRNE, throughout chapters on the Objectives (chapter 2), Hosting and Development (chapter 3), and Design and Structure (chapter 4). This report outlines the website's development process, its objectives, structure, design, and ongoing management to ensure optimal functionality and visibility.

## 2. Website Objectives

The NoLeFa website is designed to function as a central hub for project-related information, facilitating the dissemination of non-confidential project updates, reports, and deliverables to a broad audience. By offering accessible and up-to-date information, the website engages

stakeholders, researchers, and the general public, fostering interest in and awareness of the project. Additionally, the website enhances transparency by regularly sharing project progress and outcomes, allowing stakeholders to track developments and access relevant materials. To further strengthen engagement, the website hosts key events, publications, and news items, ensuring that all relevant project activities are prominently displayed. Another essential function of the website is to provide a communication channel for interested parties, enabling them to connect with project partners and consortium members for collaboration and inquiries.

### 3. Website Hosting and Development

The NoLeFa website is developed in WordPress and hosted by domaindiscount24. CAIRNE, as the lead partner for task T6.1 "Outreach," is responsible for website management and administration. To optimize performance, security, and user experience, several plugins have been integrated, including CookieYes for GDPR compliance, All in One SEO for search engine visibility, and Google Analytics for WordPress by MonsterInsights to provide insights into visitor interactions and engagement. The website undergoes periodic reviews and updates to reflect project developments, methodologies, and impacts throughout its duration. By maintaining an up-to-date and user-friendly website, NoLeFa ensures effective communication and engagement with relevant stakeholders throughout the project's lifespan.

### 4. Website Design and Structure

The NoLeFa website design aligns with the project identity set and will be further detailed in Deliverable T6.2 "Dissemination and Communication Plan." The WordPress theme, Neve, was chosen for its fast-loading times, high customizability, AMP optimization, and fully responsive design, ensuring seamless access across devices, including smartphones and web browsers.

The website is structured for intuitive navigation, ensuring ease of access to key information. The header features the NoLeFa logo, which links to the homepage, along with the main navigation menu (Figure 1**Erreur ! Source du renvoi introuvable.**).

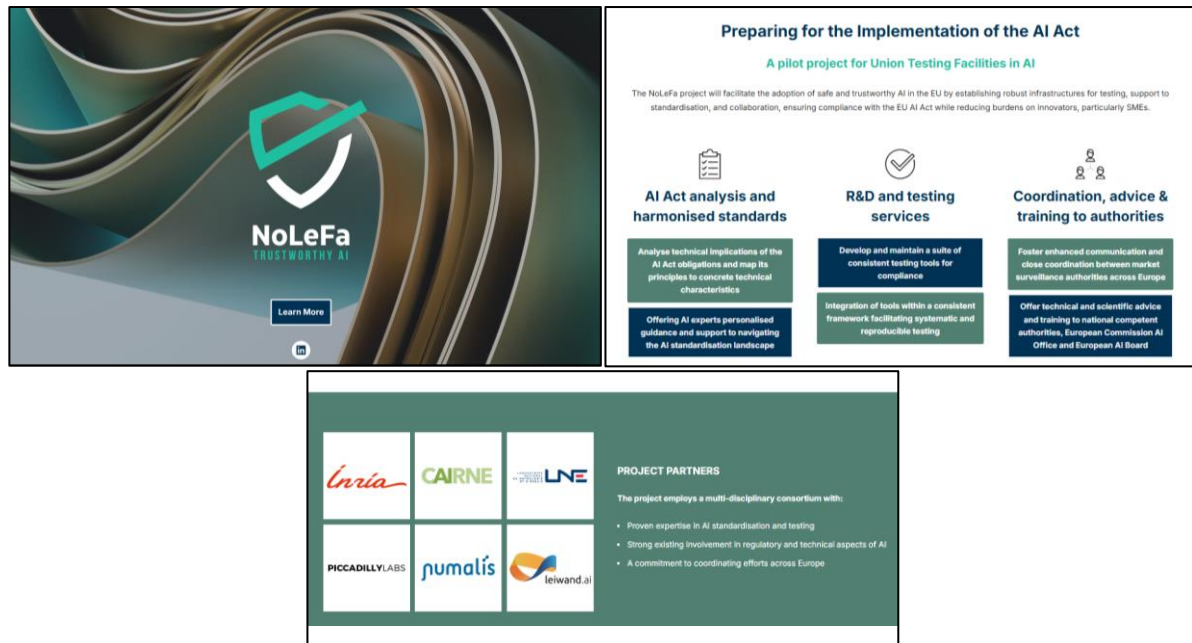


Figure 2. NoLeFa website homepage.

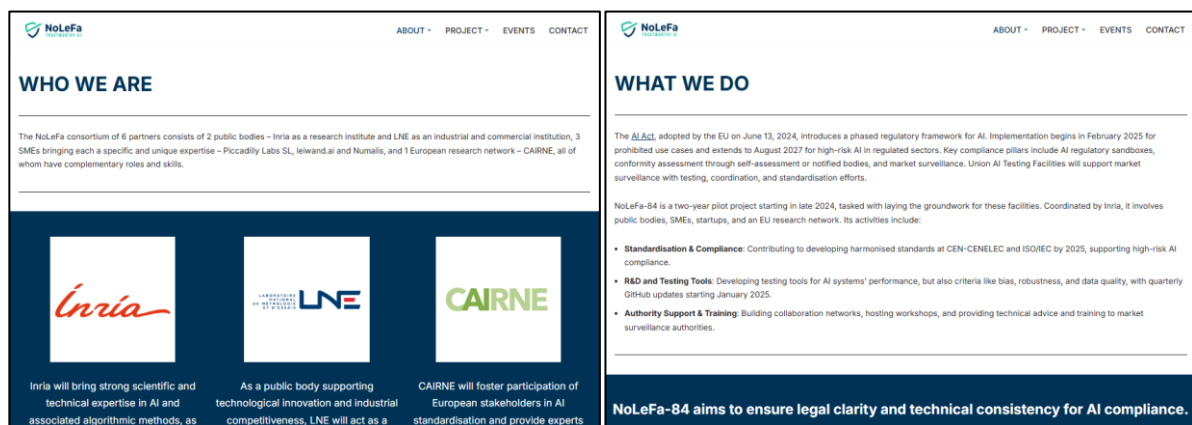


Figure 3. Who WE ARE and WHAT WE DO webpages.

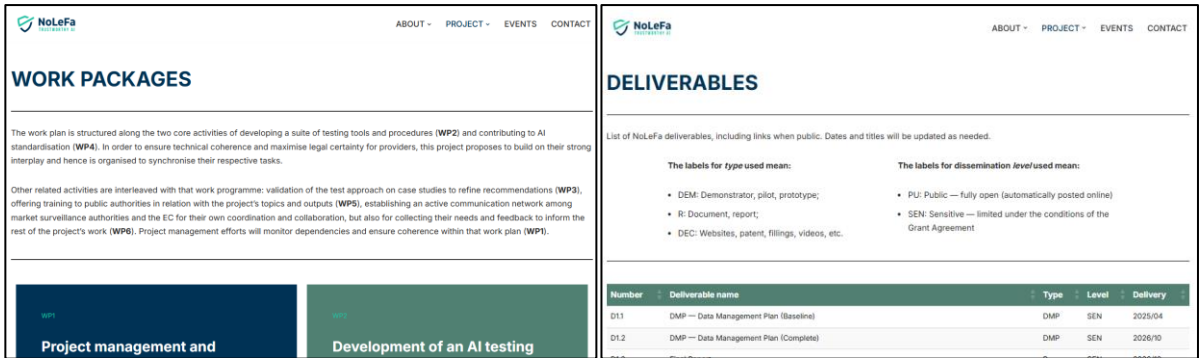


Figure 4. WORK PACKAGES and DELIVERABLES webpages.

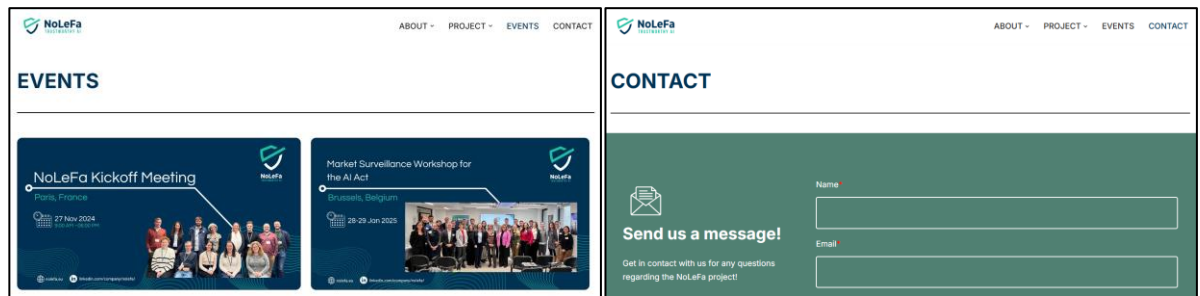


Figure 5. EVENTS and CONTACT webpages.

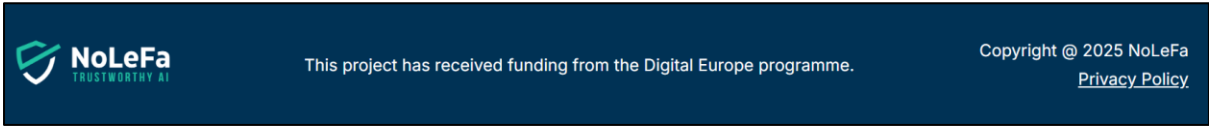


Figure 6. NoLeFa website footer.

The footer includes a funding acknowledgement from the European Union's Digital Europe Programme and provides access to the Privacy Policy<sup>8</sup> (Figure 6).
